Region: North-west Navarra

Rolling green valleys of Baztan & Bidasoa near the coast in the west Explore the historic, pretty villages of Lesaka, Etxalar, Elizondo... Dip into the picture-postcard French Pais Basque Ride the train to the top of La Rhune for stunning views of the Bay of Biscay The delightful 39km Via Verde de Bidasoa – a Paradise for cyclists & walkers alike Pop to the coast at Hondarribia, Biarritz or San Sebastian


Village hotel, French border

This delightful rural hotel set on the edge of the village of Urdax right on the Spanish - French border offers the visitor a wealth of contrasts; to the one side the Navarran Pyrenees with fantastic walking and beautifully preserved villages and to the other the gently rolling meadows of the French Pays Basque, each side with its own traditions and with a gastronomic culture among the best in the land. Stage 2



Region: Sobrarbe, Ordesa National Park, Guara & Somontano

Ordesa & Monte Perdido National Park, the essence of the Pyrenees. Christian Ainsa and Muslim Alquézar - delightful medieval villages. Sierra y Cañones de Guara, cut through by spectacular gorges - a playground for outdoor fans. Somontano wines - low yield, exceptional quality. Known for red wine but don't miss the Chardonnay! Posets Maladeta, with Aneto, the Pyrenees' highest peak. Wonderful bird-life, eagles, vultures, & the magnificent lammergeyer. Beach days and canoeing on the reservoir, take a spin around the sunken church tower.

Mountain hotel Pyrenees

This 16th century stone-built manor house at the heart of the Ainsa valley has been recently restored to a very high standard and is truly enchanting. The combination of stone walls, natural materials, subdued lighting and soft music create a welcoming and cosy atmosphere the ideal retreat after a day's arduous hiking, touring or wine tasting. The views from every window and the inviting terrace mean that the mountains come to you and you ma...<u>Read More</u>

Region: Val D'Aran & Val D'Aneu

Magnificent Parc Nacional d'Aigüestortes i Estany de Sant Maurici Unique culture and dialect in the Val d'Aran Natural Park of the high Pyrenees Fine collection of churches from Romanesque, Renaissance and Baroque Excellent bird watching, in the valleys and the high mountains Mountain gastronomy with local cheeses, honey and even caviar! Mountain hotel with pool

At the heart of the Val d'Aneu, the gateway to the National Park of Sant Maurici y Aigüestortes, with a pretty lake right at the foot of the garden, this hotel promises the very essence of the Pyrenees. Region: Girona & Costa Brava

Walk on the Camí de Ronda, all along the Costa Brava Fishing villages and beach hopping along the Costa Empuries, Roman ruins on the bay of Roses Visit the bodegas of the Empordá wine region Pals & Peratallada, delightful medieval villages Jewish heritage, medieval old-town and fortress-Cathedral in Girona capital Dalí's museum in Figueras and Cadaqués his place on the Med Sailing, stand-up paddle and diving. Cycling on the local Via-Verdes






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Stage 5



Region: Lleida Capital

Visit the Seu Vella and Castell de la Suda set atop the mount Get active or just wander in the Parc Municipal de la Mitjana Museo Automocion Roda – a small, private motor museunm Museu de Lleida – discover the city's history from pre-historic times Arborètum Jardí Botànic De Lleida a delightful green space in the city

Parador de Lleida

Housed in the 17th century Convento del Roser, the 4-star Parador de Lleida is well placed for the Old Town, the river and the Seu Vella cathedral and Santa Cecilia park which surrounds it. The hotel is comprised of two buildings: the church, which houses the Marmita restaurant and the hotel complex, with 53 rooms set around the convent's beautiful cloister which serves as lobby and lounge. The city centre is just ten minutes' walk fro...<u>Read More</u>





Stage 6



Region: Northern Zaragoza

Uncastillo - Spain's best-kept 12th century Romanesque village. 'Spaghetti Western' landscapes in Las Bardenas Reales biosphere reserve Sos del Rey Catolico - birthplace of Fernando the Catholic King Walking, cycling, mountain biking, birdwatching, canoeing... Imposing Castillo de Loarre and nearby stunning rock formations of Mallos de Riglos. Olite, Javier, Leyre - a medieval smorgasbord Dramatic gorges of Lumbier and Arbayun Senda Viva park and zoo - a great day out for the kids.

Historic posada in medieval setting

Walk out of the door of this lovingly restored 18th century town house and step straight back in time into 12th century medieval Uncastillo, Spain's finest Romanesque site. Here you'll find no 'Old Town' just a living museum, untouched by the passing of time. Near the once-strategic border of Navarre and Aragón the local area boasts an architectural heritage of immense importance, including the castles of Javier, Olite and the colossal Loarre...<u>Read More</u>









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Stage 7



Region: La Rioja wine region

La Rioja Alavesa, where the mountains give shelter to the best wineries Riojan cuisine- excellent local ingredients with a touch of Basque flair A history of architecture from cave-dweller to Gehry Medieval towns such as Laguardia, thriving centers of the wine trade Dinastia Vivanco Museum of Wine Culture, one of the finest private collections in the world. Magical theme hotel in C17th mansion in La Rioja


This fine 17th century mansion, in the centre of the picturesque, medieval village of Cuzcurrita del Rio Tiron, in La Rioja Alta, has been recently restored but certainly has a history! Originally the home of a wealthy family, in the 1920's and 30's, the building was put to use as a bakery, theatre and cinema before, during the Civil War, being occupied by Italian troops who passed on their pasta recipes to the locals.
